ENGLISH

ACCION 21

AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Statement 1: The government should subsidize housing projects to make homes affordable for low-income families.

The government should also regulate vacation rentals, as more than 5,000 units have been removed from the residential market and shifted to the tourism industry.

Statement 2: Rent control measures should be implemented to prevent rapid increases in housing costs.

Providing affordable housing is crucial, especially for young professionals. FCCA already offers rental price control based on income, but their inventory is insufficient to meet demand. Inventory should be expanded, including apartments in city centers, without distorting the market.

Statement 3: Foreign buyers should pay an additional tax on property purchases to reduce housing scarcity.

We prefer to regulate which properties can be sold to foreigners, similar to Switzerland. Special permits should be required to sell to foreigners, based on specific criteria.

COST OF LIVING

Statement 4: The minimum wage should be increased to provide a living wage for all workers.

A minimum wage should guarantee a basic survival level. Fiscal incentives for businesses must accompany any increase in the minimum wage; otherwise, it will lead to inflation.

<p>Statement 5: Taxes on luxury goods should fund poverty alleviation and social services.</p>	<p>Aruba already has an economy of over 7 billion for an official population of 107,000, so poverty shouldn't exist. However, 27% of households live with expenses exceeding their income. We must restructure how the government finances itself instead of introducing or raising taxes.</p>
<p>Statement 6: The government should implement measures to make living costs more affordable for Aruban residents.</p>	<p>This requires redesigning our tax system and making the public sector more efficient and less costly.</p>
<p>Statement 7: Additional support should be provided for retirees facing high costs of living.</p>	<p>We want to increase pensions by 50%, reduce their AZV premium by half, exempt them from income tax on pensions, and exclude them from any cuts in healthcare services.</p>

DIVERSIFYING THE ECONOMY

<p>Statement 8: The government should prioritize developing the tech and innovation sectors.</p>	<p>We aim to introduce an Innovation Development Fund to invest in sustainable industries and technologies.</p>
<p>Statement 9: Taxes on tourism should support the growth of other economic sectors.</p>	<p>In redesigning the tax system, we want to allocate more revenue from tourism to government coffers.</p>
<p>Statement 10: Local agricultural initiatives should receive subsidies to reduce Aruba's dependence on imported food.</p>	<p>Aruba needs to develop a production level together with Curaçao and Bonaire to ensure food security. Local farmers need protection and subsidies, but we do not want a rise in the consumer prices, it must remain competitive.</p>
<p>Statement 11: Investment in creative industries (e.g., film, music, fashion) should be part of Aruba's economic diversification.</p>	<p>We plan to launch a pilot program to subsidize 600 people in creative industries with a minimum salary to produce works that become national heritage.</p>



Statement 12: The government should reduce barriers for small business owners and entrepreneurs.

We will introduce a two-year tax holiday for new entrepreneurs and establish a one-stop shop to connect them with all necessary institutions for starting and operating their businesses.

Sustainable Tourism

Statement 13: Tourist numbers should be capped to protect Aruba's natural environment.

We have exceeded our capacity, destroying 90% of our natural environment. Limiting visitor numbers is essential to safeguard the environment and ensure continued prosperity while focusing on higher-spending tourists.

Statement 14: All hotels and resorts should be required to meet eco-friendly certification standards.

We need to demand that our tourism industry operate more sustainably.

Statement 15: More funds should be allocated to restore natural areas affected by tourism.

Funds must be allocated for nature preservation and regeneration. Our first step to address the ecological, environmental, and climate crises is to expand the Aruba National Park to include all of Aruba's territories, both land and marine zones.

LABOR CONDITIONS

Statement 16: The government should recruit skilled workers from abroad for sectors facing shortages.

Aruba is overpopulated, but we need some level of immigration to ensure enough workers for our growing elderly population.

Statement 17: The government should mandate flexible work options to improve work-life balance.

This is essential and creates more opportunities for young people to gain experience. However, implementing the Arboret (Occupational Health Law) and a social safety net must happen before we can make labor laws more flexible.



ALTERNATIVE ENERGY

<p>Statement 18: Government investments in wind and solar infrastructure should be expanded to reduce oil dependence.</p>	<p>Renewable energy is already cheaper than fossil fuels. The government must facilitate the transition with a plan to achieve 90% renewable energy, as seen in the BES islands.</p>
<p>Statement 19: Homeowners and businesses should receive financial support for installing solar panels.</p>	<p>Those with fewer resources should receive support to transition to renewable energy. FCCA could install solar parks in the form of carports in cooperation with residents of social housing to help lower electricity costs.</p>

<p>Statement 26: Programs to retain skilled Aruban graduates and reduce brain drain should receive government investment.</p>	<p>The government should pay student loans if graduates return to Aruba and stay for at least five years, encouraging local talent to remain or return.</p>

GOOD GOVERNANCE & FINANCES

<p>Statement 27: Government officials should be subject to stricter transparency and anti-corruption regulations.</p>	<p>Transparency in governance is essential, the entire budget must be made public.</p>
